

Employment Rates


Disabled people are **less likely to be employed** than people without disabilities in Ireland.

Employment and Gender

Both males and females with a disability are less likely to be working than people without a disability of the same gender. Whether you are male or female, your chances of working are **43% higher** if you don't have a disability.

Some people of working age are not working but are actively looking for work. We refer to these people as unemployed. Other people are not working and are not seeking work, perhaps because they are students, retired, looking after their homes or families, or are unable to work due to disability or illness. We refer to these people as being outside the labour force.

People with a disability are more likely to be outside of the labour force.

Around I in 4

people without a disability are outside the labour force.




Around I in 3

people with a disability to some extent are outside the labour force.

Around 2 in 3


people with a disability to a great extent are outside the labour force.

Of those in the labour force, people with disabilities are more likely to be **unable to find work.**



How does the disability gap in Ireland compare to that in other countries?

The gap between the employment rates of people with and without a disability is often called the 'disability employment gap'. **Ireland has a higher disability gap than on average across the European Union.**
